

Ancient Civilization Study Guide

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A prehistoric period that lasted from 2,500,000-8000 B.C. and during it people made use of stone tools and weapons (also known as the old stone age). Neolithic Period (new stone age) A prehistoric period that began in 8000 B.C.- 3000 B.C. and during it people learned to polish stone tools, make pottery, grow crops and raise animals.
