Susceptibility: the lack of resistance to injury, foreign proteins and invading pathogens Innate immunity includes external physical and chemical barriers (skin and mucous membranes) and various internal defenses (phagocytes, natural killer cells, antimicrobial proteins); It does not involve specific recognition of a microbe, acts against all ...

cell. There are 3 types of Interferons: Alpha-interferons= is produced by cells infected with viruses. They attract and stimulate NK cells and enhance resistance to viral infection. Beta-interferons= is secreted by fibroblasts and slows inflammation in a damaged area. Gamma-interferons= is secreted by T cells and NK cells and stimulates macrophage activity.
