How to Tune Your Rig | North Sails
Rig tuning might seem to some like a black art, but once you master the basics you will be set for life. Tuning your rig - left adding turns, right measuring the tension using a vernier gauge. To check the adjustment of your rig start by sailing close-hauled with the boat nicely powered up at around 20 degrees of heel -- ideally with full sail in flat water and around 10-14 knots of wind, depending on the vessel.

The settings that have been used for this tuning guide are based around a Solo sailor weighing 8085kg using a Selden D+ mast and North Sail. However these settings still apply providing you use the correct mast and sail combination for your weight. The settings are dependent on sea state, weight, mast, sail and fitness.
